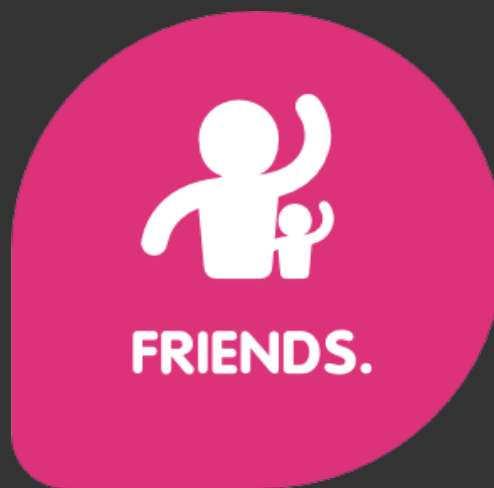
- GNU/Linux Distribution.

Our Mission

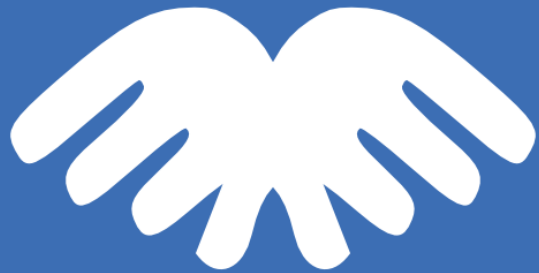


The Fedora Project's mission is to lead the advancement of free and open source software and content as a collaborative community.

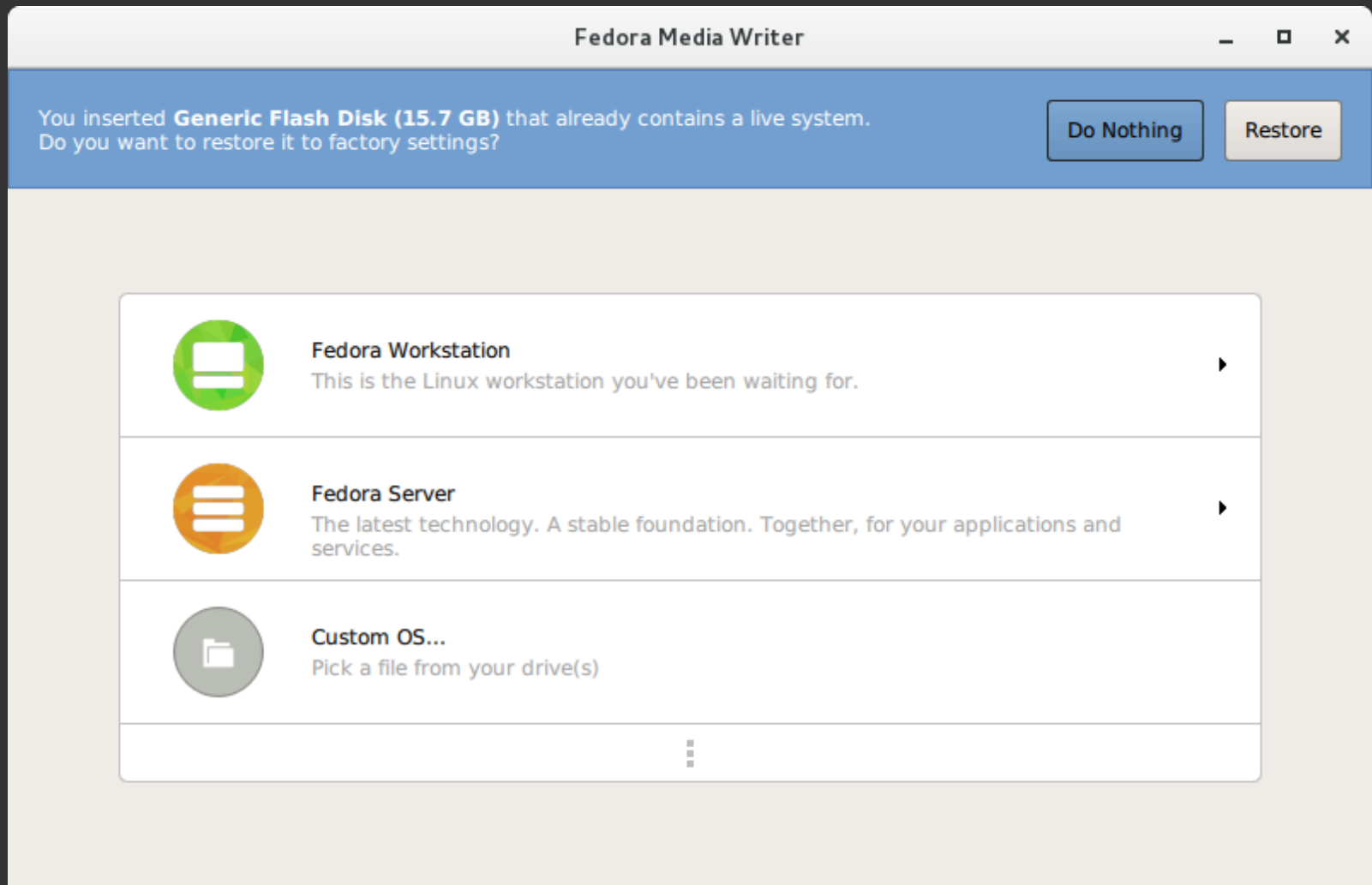

- Work on projects including: the Fedora Logo, Badges, Marketing Collateral, Promo Banners, Media Art, T-Shirt Design.

Skills: Design, GIMP, Inkscape, LibreOffice.

- Teams within the Fedora Project; a first stage in the development of new projects.
